Research Scientist (PhD Position)

working in a research project to investigate the cognitive mechanism of deceptive actions in sports, which is funded by the German Research Foundation (DFG). The position will be part-time (65%) for a **PhD student**. It is intended to support scientific qualification in accordance with German law and regulations (Wissenschaftszeitgesetz [Wiss-ZeitVG]), leading to a PhD thesis. The duration of the position to be filled is at least three years, depending on the qualification of the applicant.

Tasks:

- Conducting experimental studies in the DFG-project entitled „The head-fake effect in Basketball under quasi-realistic settings“ (WE 2800/9-1)
- Writing scientific publications
- Providing support in the academic self-administration

Requirements:

- for a PhD student: Master's degree (or equivalent) in psychology or movement science
- for a Postdoc: Doctoral degree (PhD) in psychology or sport science

Desired qualifications and competences:

- Fundamental expertise in conducting experimental studies using behavioral and/or neuroscience methods
- Strong data analyses, statistic and programming skills (e.g., MATLAB, Presentation, C++)
- Team player, cooperativeness, reliability, and self-management skills

The Paderborn University intends to increase the number of women working at the university and, therefore, encourages the application of qualified female scientists. Applications of women will be given preference, unless there are prevailing rational reasons in the person of a male applicant. Part-time employment is possible. Upon equal qualification, applicants with a handicap will be given preference (SGB IX).
