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Annual Conference of the national society

1. One-day seminar: "Children, motor development and self concept"

18 March 2000; at the Institute of Exercise and Sport Sciences, University of Copenhagen.

Professionals like physical educators, psychologists, physiotherapist and teachers often have the idea that positive motor development has a positive influence on the self-concept and the cognitive development of the child. The seminar wanted to give an overview about the myths and realities of possible connections. Furthermore, it was the intention of the organisers to work towards an integration between theory and practice.

Invited lecturers were:

Reinhard Stelter, PhD, President of DIFO, presented his own research project on the subject. In his lecture "Children, motor development and self concept" he showed that there is no certain evidence in regard to a positive correlation between motor development and self-concept, measured on the basis of scale on general self-efficacy.

Thomas Moser, researcher from the University College of Vestfold, Norway, continued to give nuances in this picture. His inspiring lecture was entitled: "Body and mind – Myths and reality in regard to the interrelation between motor development, cognitive learning and self-image".

Lise Ahlmann, physiotherapist and psychologist gave the final presentation before the general debate. In her lecture "Movement and development – theory and practice" she managed to combine her research with an applied perspectives. Her expertise was an inspiration for many of the young practitioners in the field.

The seminar was well attended by about 50 participants.

2. Two-day conference: "Sport injuries and pain – an interdisciplinary approach"

27-28 October 2000; at the Institute of Exercise and Sport Sciences, University of Copenhagen.

The seminar tried to give an understanding of the topic from the research perspective, from the perspective of physiotherapy, and from the standpoint of the sport participant.

The intention was to focus on the theme by integrating theory and practice.

Presentations by:

Bente Andersen, a physiotherapist from the Copenhagen School of Physiotherapy, gave a lecture about the psychological aspects in physiotherapy.

Thorsten Ingemann, professor at the Centre of Sport at the University of Århus and specialist in physical medicine, gave an overview about different types of sport injuries and the possible psychological consequences. His lecture had the title "What we cannot see".

The former Denmark champion and participant in many international long-distance running competitions, Dorthe Rasmussen, presented her view as a sport person who had to live with injuries and pain throughout her whole carrier. Her lecture: "The necessity of pain".

From the perspective of a former elite gymnast on the one hand and through the glasses of a coach on the other hand, Lars Elbæk, lecturer at the Institute of Sport Science and Biomechanics, University of Odense,

gave a lecture where he presented his life story as an athlete focusing on both the happy moments in sport and on injuries and pain

The final lecture was given by Dr. Kirsten Roessler, who presented first results about her research project on sport and pain.

25 people attended the conference.

Reinhard Stelter & Helle Rønholt

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The aim of the research project is to carry out a study of children's learning and identity processes in different social contexts (home, institution, school and leisure-time) especially in relation to bodily and sport activities. The target group of the project are fourth graders. The project is based on the following research questions:

1. How do children experience and involve themselves in sport at school, at home and in their leisure-time?
2. How are learning and identity processes manifested in different social contexts?
3. Which influence do sport, body and movement have on children's learning and identity processes?

The project sees learning as a dialogue in relation to the situation. All learning has also an influence on the development of self and identity, which is a very situational process as well. The empirical part of the project (video observation of PE-lessons, field observations of the leisure time of the children, qualitative interviews) is completed. The analysing procedure will go until 2001. The whole project will be finished in the year 2002

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Annual Conference

The asp annual conference was held from June 1st until June 3rd at the German Sport University Cologne. It was organized by Jürgen Nitsch and Henning Allmer. 173 scientists from Germany and other countries participated. „Thinking - Language - Movement" was the central theme of the conference. Keynotes were given by Wildor Hollmann (Brain, circulation, metabolism and psyche), Theo Herrmann (Thinking and speech) and Jörn Munzert (Imagery and motor processes). Furthermore round about 85 papers and posters referring to different areas of Sport Psychology were presented in 16 sessions. The conference ended with a keynote by Henning Allmer about the future of (German) sport psychology. A conference report edited by
