It is assumed that both cognitive and other personal factors, behavior, and environmental events all influence one another bi-directional. In our work we are focusing on both exercise and sport behavior and our theoretical models built to answer exercise and sport questions come from an interdisciplinary knowledge base as well as from mainstream psychology.
